FOR THE NEIGHBORHOOD!

THE AIR WE BREATHE...





In Buncombe County, the *Western North Carolina Regional Air Quality Agency* monitors air quality and enforces state and federal air quality standards to ensure the safety and purity of the air we breathe.

One of the ways in which they do this, is by maintaining an ozone monitoring station. The station analyzes air quality and sends information to the agency every hour.

An ozone monitoring station is essentially a small building, with a tall slender pipe for air intake, that houses special equipment. Recently the agency was mandated to find a new location, as their previous location no longer met the rigid EPA guidelines for the placement and surroundings of the station. Buncombe County was required to move the station within one mile of it's original location. Our park was the only property they had that could meet the strict criteria.

Because of the supportive relationship we have had with Buncombe County over the years, our park has developed into a clean and open gathering place. We welcome them as they join us and we support this agency whose sole directive is to safeguard our health, the environment in which we live, and the air we breathe.

The presence of a clean and open park greatly improves the home value and safety of all Bent Creek area residents while nurturing a sense of community that can be difficult to find in these busy times.

A NOTE FROM THE GATEKEEPER

As more people hear about our park and we see more folks using this space in our neighborhood it is important to remember that although we do not own the land we do lease it and the county has entrusted us to maintain it. It is the product and result of hard work by many and we should be proud of this 22-acre gem we have in the middle of Bent Creek.

Recently there have been groups of individuals coming out who may not have the best interest of the park in mind. Youth that choose to litter their garbage as opposed to using one of the five trash cans. Individuals that drive way too fast with kids biking and playing nearby. Kids with bad language who don't seem to care who's listening.

Let me say the vast majority of those who use the park don't fall into this category and that's the good news. I think as more and more families come out and use the park a positive tone will be set. However, if you see a teen doing something that they shouldn't, and you feel comfortable approaching them, by all means be a diplomat and generate some dialogue. If it is something serious that you feel needs addressing by the authorities then know you can call the 24-hour Buncombe County Sheriff's line at 255-5555.

Bottom line, this is public land, it's a public park, so we don't control who comes to visit. What we can control is how folks behave when they are in our neighborhood and around our children, so asking them to be respectful of their surroundings only seems fair. Let's challenge ourselves to be positive role models along the way as we get out there ourselves and enjoy the park!

Community Garden
